It is our hope that the sessions would be fruitful and take-home messages shall be those that shall impact positively on the health of our mothers throughout pregnancy and beyond.


I wish us all, success and journey mercy back home at the end of the session / conference.

BRIEF CITATION OF KEYNOTE SPEAKER PROF. DILLY ANUMBA



Dilly Anumba (*MBBS, FWACS, MD, FRCOG, LLM Medical Law*) is a Professor of Obstetrics & Gynaecology at the University of Sheffield and Honorary Consultant in Obstetrics and Maternal and Fetal Medicine, The Jessop Wing Sheffield. He is the Faculty Director for Clinical Academic Training.

Dilly runs specialist clinics in High-Risk Pregnancy and Fetomaternal Medicine (Prenatal Diagnosis, Perinatology, Fetal Therapy). He is Lead Clinician for the Maternal Medicine Unit of the Sheffield Teaching Hospitals. He has more than 20 years of experience in training Fetomaternal Medicine specialists and subspecialists having served at the RCOG to develop and shape agenda for various curriculums and research agendas within the Specialty and Subspeciality. He has supervised 15 PhD and MD candidates, 15 MSc candidates and similar numbers of Intercalating Undergraduate Medical Students. He is extensively published and a named inventor on two global patents for technology innovation for preterm birth management.

His research interests focus on the physiology of human birth, reproductive immunology, placental function and disorders, preterm birth, and improving health equity for women/families. He conducted various funded researches as Chief Investigator by the UK's Department of Health and Social Care (the National Institute for Health Research, NIHR), the Medical Research Council and the Engineering and Physical Sciences Research Council (EPSRC) amongst others. His UK research has “rippled out” into Global Health as Principal Investigator on the NIHR-funded Global Health Research Group on Preterm Birth Prevention and Management in LMIC (PRIME-involving researchers in South Africa, India, Bangladesh, Nigeria and Ghana) and serves on the Preterm Birth Committee of the International Federation for Obstetrics and Gynaecology (FIGO). He also serves on the national Integrated Clinical Academic Training Committee (INTERACT), the NIHR Advisory Group for Clinical Academic Training, and is Chair of four Selection Committees of the NIHR including the Short Placement Award for Research Collaboration (SPARC) and the Global Health Research SPARC. He is currently a member of the RCOG Council serving to represent sub-Saharan Africa.



PROFILE OF PROFESSOR BOSEDE B AFOLABI

Institutional affiliation: Department of Obstetrics and Gynaecology, College of Medicine, University of Lagos; Centre for Clinical Trials, Research and Implementation Science, University of Lagos, Idi-Araba, Lagos, Nigeria

Bosedé Afolabi is a Professor of Obstetrics and Gynaecology at the College of Medicine, University of Lagos (CMUL), Lagos, Nigeria. She graduated as a medical doctor (MBChB) from the Obafemi Awolowo University, Ile-Ife, Nigeria and got her postgraduate qualifications in Obstetrics and Gynaecology (O&G) from the Royal College of Obstetrics and Gynaecology (MRCOG), UK, the West African College of Surgeons (FWACS) and the National Postgraduate Medical College of Nigeria

(FMCOG). She also obtained a postgraduate doctorate in Medicine (DM) in Obstetrics and Gynaecology from the University of Nottingham, UK in 2011 for a doctoral thesis measuring and exploring the determinants of plasma volume expansion in sickle cell pregnant women.

Prof. B. B. Afolabi became a full Professor of Obstetrics and Gynaecology in November 2016 and is the current Head of Department of the Department (HOD) of Obstetrics and Gynaecology of the College of Medicine, University of Lagos and the Lagos University Teaching Hospital. Bosedé is the Director of the Centre for Clinical Trials and Implementation Science (CCTRIS) in the University of Lagos and Chief Investigator (CI) of grants worth over \$8m USD in total, from TETFund Nigeria, Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation and Mayo Clinic Florida, overseeing clinical trials with hybrid effectiveness – implementation designs as well as pure implementation science research. She has a certificate in Epidemiology and Biostatistics from the Harvard T Chan School of Public Health, Boston and is passionate about research, evidenced by the fact that she is one of the few clinicians at the College of Medicine to hold a postgraduate doctoral research degree. She is a co-investigator in the Fogarty/NIH Northwestern/Nigeria Research Training Grant for HIV and Malignancies as well as a co-investigator and e-learning coordinator for the \$3.2 million Fogarty/NIH grant (no 5D43TW010134-03) awarded to her institution for improving research and education in junior faculty. In these and other roles, she has mentored and supervised over 22 postgraduate students and junior academics in their postgraduate dissertations and research projects and is currently supervising 5 PhD students.

Her more recent accolades and awards include: Excellence in research award by the Society of Obstetricians and Gynaecologists of Nigeria (SOGON) November 2022; Ojo Memorial Lecturer at the 56th Annual Scientific Conference of SOGON, November 2022; Special Recognition Award 2021, by the Physician of the Year Awards committee, an annual award making body made up of a committee of Nigerian medical doctors; First Vice President of the Association of Fetomaternal Medicine Specialists of Nigeria 2021 (AFEMSON); She received a “Letter of Commendation” from the Vice Chancellor of the University, which referred to her as a “visionary leader” and celebrated her “institutional loyalty, professionalism and dedication to service”. She delivered the 342nd Inaugural lecture of the University of Lagos, titled Maternal Medicine: Journeys of Women in Pregnancy, Delivery and Sickle Cell Disease on the 8th of May 2019. Received an invitation from the Federal Ministry of Health to discuss policy in the management of Sickle Cell pregnancy thereafter; an Eisenhower Fellowship, USA, 2014 (a 60-year old organization headed by General Colin Powell followed by Secretary Robert Gates) for emerging global leaders involving a 7-week fully sponsored trip to various organisations of interest in the USA. She was featured on CNN African Voices in 2013, a 30-minute program that 'highlights Africa's most engaging personalities on the continent and in the diaspora every week', for her research in sickle cell pregnancy, as well as her teaching, research and efforts towards reducing maternal mortality.

She is the Chairman of the Board of Directors to the Kessington Adebukunola Adebutu Foundation (KAAF) Laboratory and Maternity Centre, a private maternity centre situated in the University of Lagos, and also chairs the Advisory Board of Sygen Pharmaceuticals Nigeria.

PROFILE OF PROFESSOR JAMILU TUKUR



Jamilu Tukur is a Professor of obstetrics and gynaecology who is currently the Provost of the College of Health Sciences, Umaru Musa Yaradua University Katsina. He is also a consultant obstetrician and gynaecologist at the Federal Teaching Hospital Katsina. He has worked in several hospitals with clinical experience spanning over 30 years. He has taught several medical students and postgraduate doctors. He has also published peer review publications in local and international journals. He is the recipient of several prizes and grants. He was recently the national coordinator of the MPD4QED programme which developed an electronic platform for routine collection of maternal and perinatal data in 54 tertiary level hospitals in Nigeria. He is also the Vice President II of AFEMSON and a member of several professional associations
